Research Code of Conduct

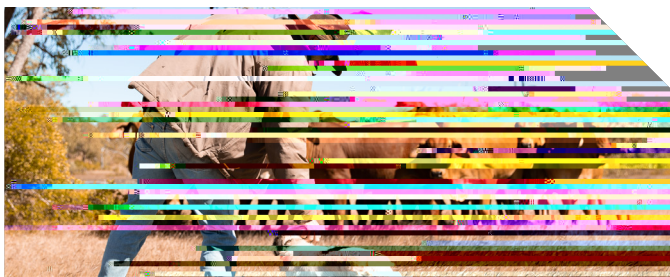
The Australian Code of Research Ethics provides the ethical framework for research involving humans. JCU has adopted the principles in the [Code of Research Ethics of Research](#). The code of ethics in research and human research:

- Manage breaches of the Code and allegations of research misconduct;
- Manage research data and materials;
- Publish and disseminate research findings, including the publication of a report;
- Conduct research ethically;
- Manage conflicts of interest.

You should refer to the Research Ethics Administration of the Code.

Animal Welfare and Ethics

Animal welfare is a priority for all research involving animals. Research involving animals can only be conducted in compliance with the relevant legislation, and



Research involving / will be conducted in an Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island community;

Take appropriate steps to ensure the safety of the research and Torres Strait Island people;

Recommendation of the research is likely to include a significant number of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island people.

Clinical Trial

A clinical trial is a form of human research designed to find out the effect of an intervention, including a treatment or diagnostic procedure.

Clinical trial in Australia can only be conducted in accordance with the National Statement on Ethical Conduct in Human Research and the current Australian Government Therapeutic Goods Administration legislation. Dealing with the name of the trial, JCU Health Service Director Human Research Ethics Committee will review the trial. Clinical trial may be registered in the publicly accessible database Australian New Zealand Clinical Trial Register.
