The winner of one of Australia's oldest and most prestigious literary awards has been chosen by the Foundation for Australian Literary Studies.

This year's winner is Gail Jones' *A Guide to Berlin*

"*A Guide to Berlin* is a very Australian book, but not one parochially," says Colin

Roderick Award Judge Dr Victoria Kuttaine. "It is a book that has shared Australian heritage."

"Australia has a long tradition of literary excellence, and it is a part of the Australian character to share much 'Australian' literature."

Celebrating its 50th

year, the Foundation presents the annual Colin Roderick Award and Priestley Memorial Medal. The Foundation is based at James Cook University and aims to foster the study and appreciation of Australian literature. To celebrate the Foundation's golden anniversary the prize money has been increased to \$20,000.

The award and medal are presented to the author of the book, published in Australia in 2015, which in the judges' opinion, best deals with any aspect of Australian life.

The Award's judges were impressed by the year's entries stating that they were of a uniformly high standard across several genres ranging from biography and memoir, to history and social commentary, to fictional and imaginative work.

The presentation was made at TAFE North in Pimlico at 8pm on Wednesday 19 October.
