

- x Difficulties in supervision when these arise and cannot be resolved by the individual sconcerned it is important hat at the earlies signs of ifficulty the <u>Student Placement</u> should be made aware of them. Open discussion of the situation before individual positions become entrenched frequently leads to resolution. The <u>student Placement</u> can provide a Placement Risk form which works as a guide to support Placement Host and provides a document of evel there necessary <u>Shedent Placements</u> <u>Team</u> involve the Subject Coordinator for assistance.
